Easy exercises parents can do with children to help identify speech, language or literacy difficulties.

Series #2: Alphabet Knowledge

i m s v qu r f w c

Show your child the letters above and answer the following questions after each:

Can your child <u>name</u> the letter?

Can your child name the sound the letter makes?

- For most of the letters you can make out the letter sound by saying (in your head!) a word that begins (or ends) with that letter
- 'qu' sounds like /kw/ as in queen
- 'x' sounds like /ks/ as in fox
- 'i' and 'o' have both long and short letter sounds, so practice both with your child
 - Long 'i' sound as in the word ice
 - Short 'i' sound as in the word igloo
 - Long 'o' sound as in the word open
 - Short 'o' sound as in the word octopus

If you say the sound the letter makes, can your child <u>write</u> the letter down on a piece of paper?

By mid-grade 1, most children can do all 3 of these tasks for most (if not all) of the letters. If your child finds this tough, connect with us to chat about what we can do to support them!
