Easy exercises parents can do with children to help identify speech, language or literacy difficulties.



Series #4: Blending Sounds into Words

Say the individual sounds broken up with a 1 second pause (don't show your child the letters). Ask your child to put the sounds together to find the secret word.

$i - n \rightarrow in$	o - ff \rightarrow off	ou - $t \rightarrow out$
$I - o - g \rightarrow log$	p - a - ck → pack	$sh - i - p \rightarrow ship$
b - I - a - ck → black	h - a - n - d → hand	c - I - i - p → clip

The ability for a child to perceive and manipulate sounds, like in this task, is a foundational skill for reading (called phonological awareness).

Blending sounds into words is crucial for children in kindergarten and grade one (and above) so they can sound out new words.
